Significant Low Levels of Lead in the Watter at BVHM

Dear students,

One of the fountains has detectable levels of lead but the level if significantly below the action threshold of 15 parts per billion (ppb). Even aggressive districts do not generally replace fixtures if the lead levels are at 5 ppb or below.

If there is concern about

the fountain that tested at 5.5 ppb, I suggest flushing it for a minute or so at the beginning of each day.



into their school libraries. We partnered with the Bay Area Discovery Museum in learning the benefits of creative play and exploration as well as creating those experiences for students. Personally, I feel that it's really important for all people, no matter what age, to express their creativity through many different means.

SB: Do you think the Creativity Club has grown?

KM: It has grown in the number of materials and activities that are offered as well as in the number of students that want to come. This year, I changed the schedule so that all grades have time to come and participate in the Creativity Club.

SB: Can you tell us about the little surprise you have for **Creativity Club?**

KM: Starting in October, the BVHM library will be partnering with the Mission Science Workshop in bringing opportunities for tinkering during Creativity Club. Students will be working with

simple motors, circuits, and other gadgets in a scientific inquiry process. It is low tech but high science and it should be great fun!

SB: Has Creativity Club made you realize anything?

KM: I have realized that what the students are doing when they explore and create is beneficial towards their overall learning. Research has shown that play and creativity actually help the brain and the learning process.

SB: What goals do you have for the Creativity Club?

KM: I want to continue giving students opportunities to create and explore but I want to guide them in their creative process and help them continue to persevere even when something doesn't work out. I would also like to have them start reflecting on what they are doing through writing and sharing with their fellow students.

SB: What advice would you give to students?

KM: Don't stop being creative, in whatever way you want to be. I want to encourage all students to keep trying and taking risks

as they participate in Creativity Club and in life. If something doesn't work the first time, try again and tell yourself: "I didn't achieve my goal YET, but I'm going to keep on trying!"
